ALCHEMIA

With support from Impact 100 Redwood Circle, Alchemia is expanding and developing community awareness and engagement surrounding the contributions of artists with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

Every artist has a voice. Alchemia supports artists who have intellectual and developmental disabilities to share their voices through the visual, performing, and



creative arts. Through their local galleries, innovative performing arts programs, and mentoring of creative projects, they raise awareness and break down barriers. Their vision is art without labels, where all artists are invited to contribute and collaborate.

When Alchemia applied to Impact 100 Redwood Circle, they had positioned themselves internally to support the growth of artists. However, as a small organization, they were challenged to sustain communication with the world outside of Alchemia. Impact 100's grant is helping Alchemia to share their life-changing work with a broader community by building their marketing and communications capability.

Using funds from the Impact 100 grant, Alchemia has:

- Promoted a member of the Alchemia team to serve as Artist Engagement Coordinator. A primary responsibility of this position is to facilitate outreach and promote artists' participation in the communities Alchemia serves. Alchemia applied a portion of their grant to start-up funding to support training and effective onboarding.
- Engaged a marketing firm to reimagine Alchemia's public-facing communications. A new website, which will eventually include links to purchase art, will launch in early 2024. Alchemia applied a portion of the grant to the first phase of the project.

ALCHEMIA (CON'T)

- Developed a second job description for a position supporting ongoing marketing and communications. This position will be opened once Alchemia's new public-facing communications are launched, and Alchemia will apply a portion of their grant to support training and effective onboarding.
- Engaged a current employee with a background in photography to capture high-quality images of artists Alchemia serves, including new artist profile pictures, for inclusion in public-facing communications. Alchemia applied a portion of their grant to fund extra hours for the employee to organize and edit images.

Subsequent to receiving the Impact 100 award, Alchemia was selected by the California Arts Council to receive an Artists in Communities grant. This funding will allow Alchemia to produce an arts festival highlighting the work of artists with disabilities in the North Bay, and (thanks to the support of Impact 100) promotion and registration will be well-presented. The festival, which will take place in May or June of 2024, is the first event of its kind in this area. Stay tuned for an invitation to volunteer or just attend!

SONOMA LAND TRUST



Sonoma Land Trust recently acquired 654-acre McCormick Ranch. This property, which straddles the boundary between Sonoma County and Napa County in the Mayacamas, will be transferred to conservation and park agencies for everyone to enjoy.

Gratitude at Thanksgiving

Like your first child, Voices has that special place in our hearts as the first Impact grant we gave in 2016. Since that time, we have donated dishes for Thanksgiving dinner for their clients. After a hiatus during some COVID years, the new leadership came

back with gusto and enthusiasm. You met one of them, LaDarius, at the November meeting.

Thirty-two members cooked and cooked; making up to 50 servings of dishes that included 3 turkeys, 7 different side dishes and tons of dessert. Dropping things off in a hectic kitchen, seeing the beautifully decorated dining room and snapping a few photos was the culmination of hard work and coordination by so many members that deserve a big thank you.

Voices was able to serve over 95 of their young adult patrons, including a take along meal and also provide dinner for 20 to 30 folks living in a sober living community. Attendees were able to participate in posting notes on a Grateful tree and of course, our food was mentioned frequently.

PHILANTHROPY IN ACTION

On cold evenings The Living Room hands out warm blankets to the women they are serving. Many of these women are experiencing homelessness and live in their cars. The supply of warm blankets at The Living Room was low on December 1 – a very cold day. Marion Weinreb, the Liaison ambassador to TLR alerted the Marketing team and they put out an emergency request to Impact 100 Redwood Circle members. Our members responded quickly and 40 blankets were delivered to The Living Room. Thanks to all our members that acted so quickly! A great example of local philanthropy in action.

100 BLACK MEN OF SONOMA COUNTY

100 Black Men of Sonoma County's charter was established in 1990 by a group of men who breakfasted together frequently at Community Baptist Church in Santa Rosa to discuss issues impacting the African American experience in Sonoma County. These men eventually formed a local chapter of 100 Black Men of America, which has headquarters in Atlanta, GA.



The mission of 100 Black Men is to serve as a catalyst to improve the quality of life within the community by providing resources, increasing awareness and focusing collective efforts towards meeting the challenges of the community by enhancing educational and economic activities. 100 Black Men seeks to serve as a beacon of leadership by using talents of local professionals to create environments to motivate the community and empowering those in it to become self sufficient shareholders in the economic and social fabric of the community.

Key programs focus on educational projects for youth of the community, such as the Financial Literacy Money Matters Project which began in 2020 in the form of workshops online, especially during Covid. Those leading the sessions found that many interested students did not have the resources for online workshops because they lacked the technology .The plan is to restart this project with in person or via Zoom monthly workshops on Saturdays for 2–3 hours, serving 100 students aged 14– 20 .This program is planned to begin the second semester of the '23–'24 school year. Students will learn about savings and checking accounts, credit cards, investments, payroll deductions, bills, interest, etc. If the students attend 80% of the monthly Saturday sessions, they will each receive a \$50 stipend at the completion of classes in the hopes they will establish a bank account.

Please stay tuned- Impact 100 members will be invited to the kickoff for the Money Matters project.




